

Give God all the Glory

'That no flesh should glory in his presence'
1 Corinthians 1:29 KJV

The story is told of a woodpecker who was pecking away on a pine tree when it was hit by a bolt of lightening and split from top to bottom. The woodpecker could hardly believe his eyes. He backed off, looked at the tree for a moment and flew away. He came back later leading nine other woodpeckers. Then with a great deal of swagger and pride he pointed to the tree and said, 'There it is gentlemen, just like I told you!'

As long as you remember to give God the credit for your success, He will keep using and blessing you. 'Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above' (James 1:17 NKJV). That means that every good thing you enjoy today and every good thing you'll need tomorrow is a 'gift' from God. Paul writes 'That no flesh should glory in his presence.' There is no bragging in heaven, just praise. Why? Because you can't brag on how you got to heaven; it's all by God's Grace. And you can't brag on what you did for God before you got to heaven, because it was all Gods calling. He says, 'I am the Lord, that is My name; and My glory I will not give to another' (Isaiah 42:8 NKJV). Again he says, 'Everyone who is called by My name, whom I have created for My glory; I have formed him, yes, I have made him' (Isaiah 43:7) NKJV).

The Transfiguration

August is a guiet month as far as the Church calendar is concerned, except that during the 11th century, some church fathers slipped in an important day - the Transfiguration of Jesus, when His disciples were given just a glimpse of His future glory (Matthew 17, Mark 9, Luke 9). Jesus took Peter, James and John, his closest disciples, up a high mountain. This is often identified as either Mount Tabor (there is a great church up there today), or one of the three spurs of Mount Hermon, which overlook Caesarea Philippi. High up on the mountain, Jesus was suddenly transfigured before His disciples. His face began to shine as the sun, His garments became white and dazzling. Elijah and Moses, of all people, suddenly appeared, and talked with Him. A bright cloud overshadowed the disciples, and a divine Voice spoke out of the cloud, saying that Jesus was His beloved son, whom the disciples should 'hear'. God's dwelling with mankind depends upon our listening to Jesus.

Then, just as suddenly, it is all over. What did it mean? Why Moses and Elijah? Well, these two men represent the Law and the Prophets of the Old Covenant, or Old Testament. But now they are handing on the baton, if you like: for both the Law and the Prophets found their true and final fulfilment in Jesus, the Messiah. That day made a lifelong impact on the disciples. Peter mentions it in his second letter, 2 Peter 1:16 - 19 - invariably the reading for

this day.





A short story from the Bible


When the Romans invaded Israel, they used soldiers to keep order. For the centurion in Capernaum it was more than just a job...
