My dear friends,

At the time of last year's Easter Vestry meeting, I wrote that 'this would be my last report,' as I was not expecting to spend another year with you, as I had been 'signed off' and I began looking forward to applying for new jobs, and hopefully finding an appointment elsewhere.



Well, fast forward a year and a bit, and we are still here, and a lot has happened inbetween!

Primrose was born last May, and as I am sure the majority of you know, having a child(ren) certainly changes your perspective on things! We have had a lovely year growing together as a family, watching Primrose grow and her personality develop, and Karin and I growing as parents and finding our own equilibrium as we come to terms with the great responsibility to which we have been entrusted. Interesting information linking Lanelay Hall to churches in Llantrisant Benefice.

During the 1890s, T.J. Masters Esq., a coal speculator and later founder of the well-known firm of clothiers, occupied Lanelay Hall. It was acquired for the County of Glamorgan, as headquarters for its Fire Service, in 1951/52, and was the home of the combined Fire services of the former counties of Glamorgan and Gwent. South Wales Fire and Rescue Service moved to their new Headquarters at Forest View Business Park during 2009 and later the site was sold.

In Llantrisant Parish Church near the main entrance door is a "Hatchment" which was moved to the church from Lanelay Hall following the death of Sir Christopher Cole.

The Llantrisant Parish Magazine for May 1900 has an article about the Llantrisant Century Fund. "In addition to the amounts previously acknowledged, we gratefully acknowledge a sum of £20.5s received from Mr. Masters of Lanelay, for the building fund of St. Paul's church, Llantrisant Station. This kind contribution wipes off the remaining deficiency on the building fund of that church, which is now free of debt. This makes the third new church recently built in the parish, the building of which is now entirely free of debt."

Mr Thomas James Masters is buried in the churchyard of the Parish Church near the west door adjacent to the path from the side gate to the church yard which also contains other members

of the Masters family. He died on the 13th March 1902.

Masters & Co clothing stores were situated in several town in South Wales including Swansea, Cardiff, Pontypridd, Aberdare and Abergavenny between the 1890s and the 1930s.

These are difficult times for all of us and reduced income for the parish/benefice over this period will have a big impact.



St James the Least of All (second time around)

On Why Holding an Arts Festival in Church is not a Good Idea.

Your decision to hold a Summer weekend Arts Festival in church, bringing culture to your inner-city streets, was most commendable. Pity, how it all turned out.

The Friday evening started well with the concert of Scott Joplin piano music. Obviously knowing that the pieces were originally played in seedy bars on pianos wildly out of tune with several notes missing, your committee must have gone to endless trouble to find precisely the right instrument. Your stage-hands, were, however, less careful and hadn't noticed that the platform had a noticeable list to port. After each piece, the pianist had to relocate the piano stool closer to his nomadic piano, with the last piece being performed with both entirely out of sight behind the pulpit.

It created much innocent entertainment for the audience, but the fault really should have been remedied before the Saturday evening choir concert. Your one great mistake was to take on responsibility for organising the refreshments afterwards. Church entertainments committees have centuries of collective experience in judging the numbers of ham sandwiches and bottles of milk required. I am forever proud that our own ladies – through years of experience – can now get five cups of tea from every tea bag and can butter bread so thinly that one pack can last several months.

What you now do with 29 surplus loaves of bread is a problem you have brought upon yourself. You could possibly use them for supporting the stage next year.

Word For Today

'Thou, O King, art the most worthy' 'Every knee will bow to the name of Jesus.' Philippians 2:10 NCV

During one of the crusades, Phillipe Auguste, King of France, assembled his noble knights and encouraged them to be strong in battle. On the table he placed his royal crown, bearing the inscription, 'To the most worthy', and pledged it as a prize to be given to the bravest fighter. After the army went to battle and returned victorious, they encircled the table where the crown sat. Then one of the nobles stepped forward, lifted the crown and placed it on the King's head, saying 'Thou, O King, art the most worthy.'

The bible says, 'Every knee will bow to the name of Jesus everyone in heaven, on earth and under the earth. And everyone will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord' (vv. 10-11 NCV). 




