#### **Rev's Ruminations**

My Dear Friends,
A second month, and we are still in lockdown. No doubt this is a really frustrating for some of you, I know that I feel that way at times. In normal times I love taking a drive to the coast to see the sea, or up towards Brecon to the mountains and revel in the wonder of God's creation.



However, I, like everyone else am mostly at home at the moment. That doesn't mean that I don't get to enjoy God's creation; for those of you who have been able to join me on Facebook from my garden, you will have heard the birds (as well as Max, the dog next door). My garden, thanks to the 'wild flowers' (weeds, mostly), is full have of Primroses and a blanket of Forget-me-nots, it is a haven for insects, especially bees, and birds, and I have been fortunate to be able to enjoy it. But there are of course the frustrations.

One of those is not having the ability to visit people at the moment. Especially, those who are sick, dying, and those who grieve. It has always been the privilege of being a vicar that I have been able to visit hospitals whenever I wished, unfortunately, that is no longer the case and it saddens me, that I have not been able to visit people before they have died. Rest assured that they are in my prayers, and I always try to remember people at our daily prayer session at 5pm on Facebook, but it isn't the same. Likewise funerals are very different at the moment, we cannot commit people to God's care from church, and gravesides and crematoria are restricted to just 10 mourners. But even there, there are reasons to be joyful. It was Karin's uncle's funeral last week. Ian was from Coytrahen near Tondu, and as the funeral cortège left the house, the streets were lined by people on their doorsteps or at a safe distance from each other, to say goodbye. There were banners, and people raising a toast, as well as applause, it was a genuinely moving tribute.

Then there are the signs of hope for us as a church. Our online services and worship are helping people connect in a way they

were unable to previously. There are housebound parishioners who are able now to join us for worship, where they were unable previously to do so. We have people viewing us from all over the world, which is lovely, but more importantly, we have people joining us from within our community, who haven't been to church, for a long time, or even at all. This is certainly part of our calling, to share The Gospel in our community. Likewise it is encouraging to see how people have supported the ministry of our parish, a big thank you to all those who have recorded, or gone live at 5, with messages and prayers for us. The videos the worship group have produced of songs, have been fantastic, and I am so grateful of all the hard work they have put in to this really important ministry here, especially Rhiannon and Miriam. Thank you also to Ceri for producing the magazine, and for Pam for producing a newsletter. Thank you to everyone who has sent a personal message of support, be it an email, letter, or phone call, your support is certainly making a difference for me, and I am very grateful to receive it. It is such a blessing to be part of a parish where people are so willing to be a part of building God's kingdom. Our new rector, Vincent will be licensed in early May, via Zoom. This means that he will start in earnest to build the new Benefice, and I know he will be delighted by how people have been working together in lockdown. Sadly, until the lockdown is lifted he will be unable to physically move, but I have no doubt he will be working hard for us, even if it is remotely.

#### **Grow Your Lawns**

The Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) has called on people to allow flowers to grow on their lawns, instead of insisting on smooth green surfaces. The reason is because nearly 7.5million acres of meadows and pastures rich in wildflowers have been lost since the Thirties, thus removing a vital source of food for pollinators, many of whom are now in steep decline.

The nation's 15 million gardens could help a lot in supporting bees, butterflies and other bugs looking for nectar.



#### **Lockdown recipes**

#### Muesli Flapjack

What you'll need:

8 inch tin Small saucepan

Baking paper Mixing bowl

#### Ingredients:

200 grams butter

200 grams dark brown soft sugar

80 grams golden syrup

500 grams muskellunge (untoasted)

50 grams pumpkin seeds (optional)

2 tsp ground cinnamon

#### Instructions

Preheat oven 160 C fan/ 180 C & lightly grease the baking tin.

Combine butter, sugar and golden syrup in the pan. Allow to simmer for 2 mins.

Stir in muesli, pumpkin seed and cinnamon.

Spoon into the tin and press down until the top is smooth.

Bake for 15-20 mins until lightly golden and set. Leave to cool for 10 mins before lightly scoring the bars.

When the flapjack is completely cool, remove from the pan and cut into bars.

I found this on the internet and made it with muesli from Truffles at the Boars Head. It's delicious!!
